
Lake Morey Ice Skating Trail - Fairlee, Vermont

Ownership: Parking access is owned and managed by the Vermont Department


of Fish and Wildlife, and the ice trail is managed and maintained

Directions

From I-91 take exit 15 in Fairlee. Off the ramp: turn west and take Lake Morey Rd West. Follow Lake Morey Rd along the western side of Lake Morey for 1.5 miles, and the Vermont Department of Fish and Wildlife Access Area will be on the right.



Description

The Lake Morey Ice Skating Trail is the longest ice trail in the United States, when ice conditions permit its full operation. Crossing the entire lake from north to south, or some winters circling the lake's perimeter, the trail offers panoramic views and the chance to spot a bald eagle. The Ice Skating Trail is the site of an annual Winter Fest in January, weather and ice conditions permitting.
